



FLORIDA LOTTO™ FAQ's

1. Can I use my current FLORIDA LOTTO™ play slip to play the new game?

No. A new FLORIDA LOTTO playslip will be required beginning March 2, 2008.

2. If I select different prices in different panels on a play slip, will I get a different ticket for each price?

No. You will receive all of your plays (up to 10) on one ticket. The price of each of your plays will be printed on the ticket.

3. If the price of my new FLORIDA LOTTO ticket is more than what I want to spend, can I cancel my ticket?

Yes. FLORIDA LOTTO tickets may be cancelled by the original selling terminal. Tickets must be cancelled within (whichever occurs first): two hours of the sales transaction, game close, or the end of the gaming system business day.

4. Will there be any changes to the FLORIDA LOTTO base game?

No. Players may continue to play FLORIDA LOTTO the way they always have. The 6 of 53 game matrix, odds of winning, and prizes will remain unchanged.

*If no FLORIDA LOTTO ticket matches all six winning numbers, the base jackpot rolls over and the cash in the base jackpot prize pool is carried over to the next drawing. The \$2 and \$3 jackpot prize pools will not be carried over.

**The estimated prize payout to each winner is based on averages of previous payouts. Actual prize amounts vary depending on sales and the number of winners in each prize category.

5. Will I be able to purchase Advance Play draws for \$2 and \$3 FLORIDA LOTTO plays?

Yes. The amount you play on each panel will apply to all Advance Play draws selected. For example, if you play 10 panels at \$3 each and select 2 Advance Play drawings on your playslip, your total cost will be \$60 (10 plays x \$3 each x 2 draws).

6. How does the new game affect my Grouper purchase?

GROUPER® is not available for \$2 or \$3 FLORIDA LOTTO plays. If you purchase a GROUPER ticket, the terminal will automatically select a \$1 FLORIDA LOTTO play.

7. Do the \$2 and \$3 jackpots rollover?

No, only the base jackpot rolls over. However, regardless of the base jackpot's roll level, the \$2 jackpot prize will always be \$10 million more than the base jackpot, and the \$3 jackpot prize will always be \$25 million more than the base jackpot.

8. If I play \$2 or \$3, will my prize for matching 3-of-6, 4-of-6, or 5-of-6 numbers be higher too?

No. At this time, \$2 and \$3 players will win the same lower-tier prizes as \$1 players. The \$2 and \$3 plays are add-ons only to the base jackpot.

9. Are the \$2 and \$3 advertised jackpot amounts cash prizes and are they shared if there are multiple winners?

The advertised jackpot(s) are the amount the Lottery will pay a single winner in 30 annual payments. If there are multiple 6-of-6 winners, the jackpot prizes will be shared equally within the applicable prize pool. Winners of the \$2 and \$3 jackpot prize pools will win their share of the applicable prize pool as well as their share of the lesser jackpot pools.

10. Is the Cash Option available on \$2 and \$3 jackpot prizes?

Yes. Players may choose to receive their portion of the FLORIDA LOTTO jackpots in a one-time, lump-sum payment (Cash Option) or in 30 annual payments. The Cash Option payment is the amount required on the day of the drawing (or if the drawing is held on a Saturday or holiday, the business day prior to the drawing) to fund the applicable jackpot prize paid over 30 years, less applicable taxes.

11. Are jackpot prizes shared if there are multiple winners?

Yes. Each of the \$1, \$2 and \$3 jackpot pools are shared among all eligible winners. \$2 players will win a share of the \$1 jackpot pool and a share or all of the \$2 jackpot pool. \$3 players will win a share of the \$1 jackpot pool, a share or all of the \$2 jackpot pool and a share or all of the \$3 jackpot pool.

Example of a shared jackpot with three jackpot winners (one of which played \$1, one which played \$2 and one which played \$3): Each winner will receive 1/3 of the base jackpot prize; the \$2 and \$3 players will each receive 1/2 of the \$10 million from the \$2 jackpot prize pool; and, the \$3 player will receive the entire \$15 million from the \$3 jackpot prize pool. If the base jackpot is \$3 million, the \$1 player will win \$1 million, the \$2 player will win \$6 million and the \$3 player will win \$21 million.
